Student Characteristics, Fall 2023

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enrollment was 43,701: 31,933 (73.1%) undergraduates, 10,582 (24.2%) graduate/professional, 1,186 (2.7%) unclassified
- 78.8% of all students were Floridians; 91.9% were from the United States
- Seventeen Florida counties contributed over 500 students each (in descending order): Leon, Broward, Miami-Dade, Hillsborough, Palm Beach, Orange, Pinellas, Duval, St. John's, Seminole, Bay, Sarasota, Brevard, Lee, Collier, Pasco, & Manatee
- Students from all 50 states and the District of Columbia were in attendance
- Twenty states contributed 100 or more students each (in descending order): Florida, Georgia, New York, New Jersey, North Carolina, Texas, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Virginia, Tennessee, Maryland, California, Ohio, Alabama, Michigan, Connecticut, South Carolina, Massachusetts, Colorado, & Missouri
- Twenty-five foreign countries contributed 30 or more students each (in descending order): India, Panama, China, South Korea, Brazil, Venezuela, Canada, Nigeria, Bangladesh, Colombia, Iran, Japan, Jamica, United Kingdom, Mexico, Pakistan, Spain, Vietnam, Haiti, Italy, Cuba, Turkey, Argentina, Peru, & Germany
- Women accounted for 57.9 percent of the total enrollment
- Minorities, including students who reported two or more races, made up 37.4% of the student enrollment who reported ethnicity. Of those 16,097 students, 55.6% were Hispanic, 23.0% Black, 9.9% Asian, 0.3% American Indian/Alaskan, 0.2% Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 11.0% Two or More Races
- International students comprise 6.5% of the 43,701 students enrolled in Fall 2023; 1.4% of students did not report ethnicity
- Average age of all students was 22.5; of undergraduates, 20.6; of graduates, 30.1; of unclassified students, 25.7
- Students enrolled full-time represented 82.0 percent of those in attendance
- The middle 50% high school GPA for the Summer/Fall 2023 first-time-in-college (FTIC) class was 4.2-4.5; middle 50% SAT scores, 1330-1410; middle 50% ACT composite scores, 29-32
- In Fall 2023, 141 National Merit Scholars enrolled, including 46 FTIC students and 95 other undergraduates. Historical counts of National Merit, Achievement, and Hispanic Scholars can be found in previous editions of the Fact Book
- Of undergraduate full-time students, 88.9% received any financial aid (need-based, merit-based, gift aid, etc.)
- Summer/Fall 2022 FTIC cohort returned to the university in 2023-2024 at a rate of 94%
- Since the Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Program was established by Congress in 1986, a total of thirty students from Florida State University have been honored:
