

Student Characteristics, Fall 2025

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enrollment was 46,184: 33,068 (71.6%) undergraduates, 11,022 (23.9%) graduate/professional, 2,094 (4.5%) unclassified
- 80.0% of all students were Floridians; 92.6% were from the United States
- Eighteen Florida counties contributed over 500 students each (in descending order): Leon, Miami-Dade, Broward, Hillsborough, Palm Beach, Orange, Duval, Pinellas, St. Johns, Bay, Seminole, Sarasota, Brevard, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Manatee, & Volusia
- Students from all 50 states and the District of Columbia were in attendance
- Nineteen states contributed 100 or more students each (in descending order): Florida, Georgia, New Jersey, New York, Texas, Illinois, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Tennessee, California, Maryland, Ohio, Massachusetts, Alabama, Colorado, South Carolina, Missouri, & Connecticut
- Students came from 133 non-U.S. countries or territories, seventeen of which contributed 40+ students (in descending order): Panama, China, India, South Korea, Brazil, Bangladesh, Venezuela, Nigeria, Canada, Japan, Colombia, Vietnam, United Kingdom, Ghana, Iran, Jamaica, & Pakistan
- Racial/ethnic minorities, including students who report two or more races, made up 39.4% of the student enrollment who reported ethnicity. Of those 17,917 students, 56.5% were Hispanic, 21.5% Black, 10.1% Asian, 0.3% American Indian/Native Alaskan, 0.1% Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 11.5% Two or More Races
- International students comprised 5.8% of the students enrolled in Fall 2025; 1.5% of students did not report ethnicity
- Average age of all students was 22.9 years; of undergraduates, 20.5; of graduates, 30.4; of unclassified students, 22.4
- Students enrolled full-time represented 80.5 percent of those in attendance
- The middle 50% high school GPA for the Summer/Fall 2025 first-time-in-college (FTIC) class was 4.1-4.5; middle 50% SAT scores, 1300-1410; middle 50% ACT composite scores, 29-32
- 85,469 applications were received for students applying for admission as FTIC students in Summer/Fall 2025; 20,364 were admitted and 6,559 enrolled
- In Fall 2025, 155 National Merit Scholars enrolled, including 59 FTIC students and 96 other undergraduates. Historical counts of National Merit, Achievement, and Hispanic Scholars can be found in the 2022-23 and prior Fact Books
- Of undergraduate degree-seeking students, 84.1% received any financial aid (need-based, merit-based, gift aid, etc.)
- The Summer/Fall 2024 FTIC cohort returned to the university in Fall 2025 at a rate of 96.6%
